"It is Finished!"

It's a big old mound of paper! My dissertation came to 375 painstaking pages, hammered out over the last five years. With the help and support and indulgence of Tait and the kids, my parents, several key friends, and the people of St. Peter's the long slog is finished. Thank you all SO MUCH!

Here's the impact it's had. I'd say that the doctoral course work (2010-2012) completely transformed the way I prepare sermons. That got the creative juices flowing in me again, and helped make the preaching clearer and more vivid and relevant. I once was stuck in a rut, but now I love preaching again. In the dissertation, I wanted to figure out how that same benefit could be made available to other preachers... without them having to endure a doctoral program!

Here's the basic idea: Most preachers need to improve. Some recognize that fact and are willing to invest time and money to do so. For those motivated preachers, however, the means of improvement are in large part inaccessible, or ineffective. My dissertation addresses that need. It develops an approach, rooted in the discipline of Christian Coaching, that is both effective and can be made easily accessible to help preachers improve.

It demonstrates the effectiveness of coaching in two ways. First, it shows how the coaching discipline is rooted in the Biblical narrative, as well as contemporary disciplines of behavior change and adult learning theory. Second, it shows how coaching helped three coaching clients measurably improve their preparation and delivery of sermons, over a one-year period. The proof is in the pudding (though I prefer bananas and Nilla Wafers!). One client said,

I've enjoyed the sense of being empowered to be a better preacher. Your approach as coach has been to trust that I have an innate ability to be a preacher. You ask lots of good questions without jumping in and telling me how to do something. It's been a real clarifying process for me and you've made that possible by not evaluating my preaching, but motivating and empowering. It makes it fun for me to preach and be excited about the changes. You've done a very good job to create the space where that change could be made.



So, the coaching course is effective. And now faculty members at Gordon-Conwell Seminary are interested in making it accessible to preachers as an offering of the Haddon Robinson Center for Preaching.

But what is "coaching"? A coach is a professional trained in the disciplines of helping people who feel stuck to move forward. A coach leverages a person's motivation, values, wisdom, skill, and responsibility to help them get where they want to go, like the horse-drawn stagecoach of old. Master Coach, Tony Stoltzfus, said coaching is "helping people solve their own problems without telling them what to do."

Coaches are change experts who cultivate a close relationship with their client, in which they help that person take responsibility and act to maximize their potential. Unlike mentoring or counseling, coaching is not about telling and directing. Instead, the genius of the coach is believing in people and what God is doing in their lives, and asking questions that help a person discover new perspectives, discern their own priorities, access helpful resources, then devise and implement their own solutions.

The Sermon Coaching course is geared toward experienced preachers, at least three years out of seminary, who feel their preaching is stuck in a rut. They're seeking fresh ideas, helpful resources, and insights to improve their preparation and delivery of sermons. That's where I was when I started the doctoral program in preaching at Gordon-Conwell Seminary, and now I'd love to help other preachers get unstuck.

I hope to offer my services as a Sermon Coach for up to four clients (two hours a week). If there is a deluge of other clients, I have friends who are professional coaches whom I could train to work with preachers. I plan to offer the same program to the Virginia Theological Seminary, and the Diocese of Virginia. My motto is "Empower the Church to change the world." Improving preaching is a great way to do that! I'm very excited at the prospect. Please pray for our Lord's guidance and provision moving forward.

Summer Adult Formation

How can St. Peter's form a vibrant community?

How should we approach the broader culture we live in?

What should be distinct about our own culture within St. Peter's?

And how should our own culture serve Christ's mandate to make disciples of all nations – and particularly Loudoun?.

How do we consider these questions in our current 21st century, secular and pluralistic America? An America that is fractious and divided. An America ruled by individualism. Where culture drastically changes in such short periods of time.

Rod Dreher, a journalist and Orthodox Christian, has been thinking and writing about a model of Christian cultural engagement for over a decade. It has culminated in *'The Benedict Option*.

"The Benedict Option," is already the most discussed and most important religious book of the decade." --- David Brooks, *New York Times*

Summer Formation will be a study of this "most important religious book of the decade," with the question: what should we do as a community?

Dreher's moves us away from models where the secular culture sets the agenda. This is a strengthened community that has it's own culture which nurtures disciples. It is neither retreat nor war with secular culture. It's a shoring up of the Church to face whatever storms lie ahead.

"But Dreher's deeper, "how to build a counterculture" argument matters regardless of whether his prophecies are accurate, because it matters in the polarized, fragmenting America that exists *right now* ... we have a severe problem of rootlessness, hyper-individualism and anomie {lack of the usual social or ethical standards} ... But only a robust counterculture, a healthy sense of their own freakishness and, yes, a few St. Benedicts will save them if they fall"

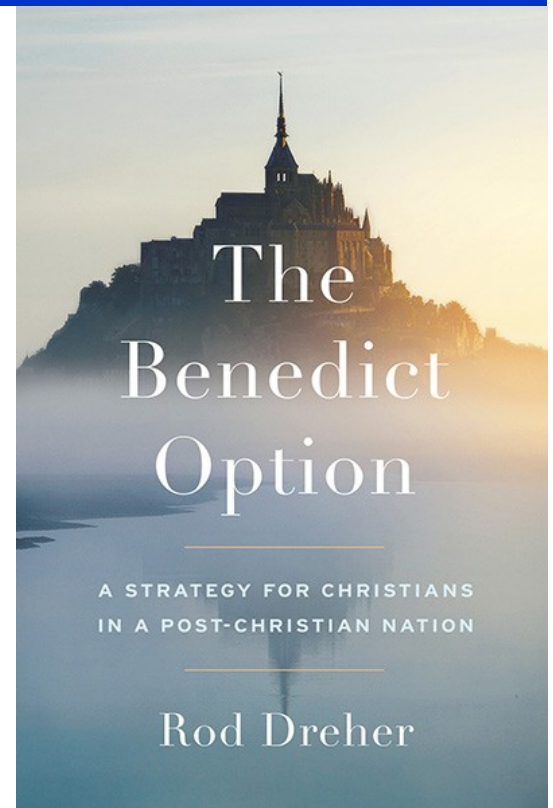

An Instrument of God!

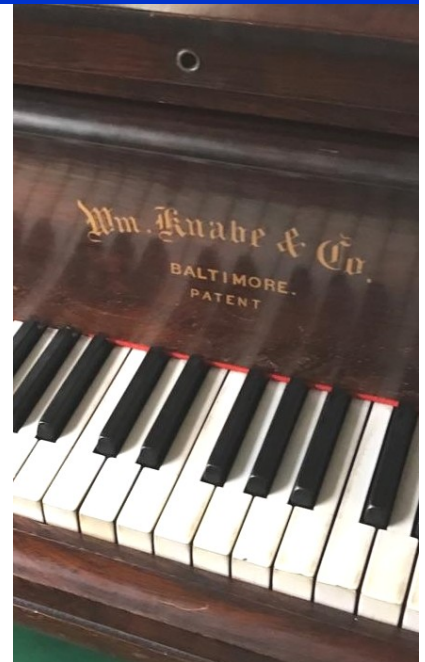

Looking for a Few Good Fellows

A lot of Christians are hungry. They are hungry for more study, community, thoughtful engagement with important issues, probing insight, and practical application than their congregation's Sunday School and small group offerings can deliver on a regular basis. They want to learn to LIVE their faith in a more challenging and effective way.

I think this search for "more" might end for many people with the C.S. Lewis Institute's Fellows Program, a year-long discipleship course designed for Christians ready to be disciplined about their spiritual growth, and who seek to be "more" useful for God's kingdom in our world.

The Fellows Program's unique approach focuses on the integration of the heart and mind in an interdenominational setting, and is designed to dramatically alter participants' trajectory of spiritual growth.

The program runs for one academic year, September through June, with summer readings beforehand and a retreat in September to formally initiate the year. Each month examines a different biblical theme, with an overall focus on spiritual formation, apologetics, evangelism and serving others.

A combination of dynamic teachers and writers, experienced mentors, effective small groups and active engagement with Scripture produces mature believers who can articulate, defend and joyfully live out their faith in every aspect of their life. It is a true feast for hungry souls seeking "more."

And it works.

A survey of our Fellows found that 76% would be willing to lead a discipleship group in their home; 100% experienced an increase in their involvement in ministry to their family and neighborhood; 88% increase in their involvement in workplace ministry; and 84% said the program has "transformed or significantly impacted their life."

Those results have been noticed by others, too.

Churches far and wide have asked the Institute to help them develop the Fellows Program in their own cities. The Fellows Program started in Falls Church in 1999, as a partnership between Columbia Baptist, Falls Church Anglican, McLean Presbyterian, and Cornerstone Evangelical Free Church. Since 2005 it has spread to other cities like Atlanta, Annapolis, Seattle, Cincinnati, London, Chicago, Youngstown, Harrisburg, Virginia Beach, and Belfast.

Now the C.S. Lewis Institute's Fellows Program has come to Leesburg.



We seek to gather a group of Fellows in the month ahead to take advantage of this tremendous opportunity. We will be accepting applications in March, and will select participants by the end of April.

There are some Admission Requirements to be aware of.

1. Completion of an application, an interview with Institute staff, and two recommendations, one of which must be from the applicant's pastor.
2. The applicant's strong desire to know and love God more deeply and to live out the gospel more faithfully and to share it with others.
3. The applicant's strong desire to actively serve Christ upon completion of the program, evidenced by a commitment and tentative plan of action.
4. The applicant's commitment to engage with the program in terms of attendance, reading, group participation, and being mentored in discipleship.
5. The applicant's willingness to be open about his or her intellectual, spiritual, and personal life along with a desire to receive insight and guidance from a spiritual mentor.
6. Support of the applicant's spouse, if married.

Each month's routine includes Scripture reading and assignments associated with the topic that month, meeting with a mentor, gathering in a group of three or four Fellows for prayer, fellowship, discussion, and/or to watch a monthly movie, and the Saturday morning Gathering for teaching and discussion.

Cost of the Program is \$3,500 per Fellow. However, due to generous support of the program, each Fellow is only responsible for their books, materials and the cost of the retreat. 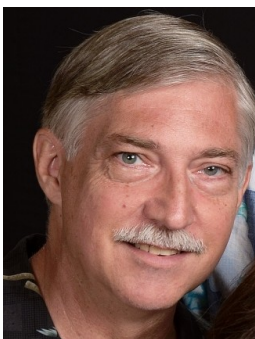

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

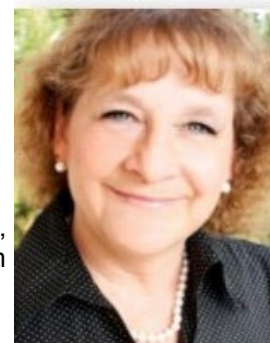

We have heard your cries!

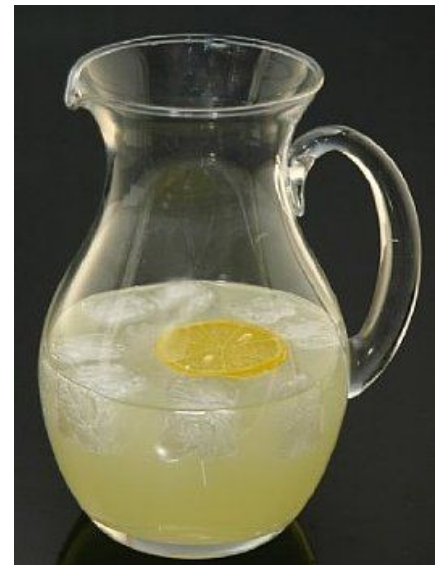
Starting with the first Sunday following the end of the Program Year, May 28, the following changes will take place:

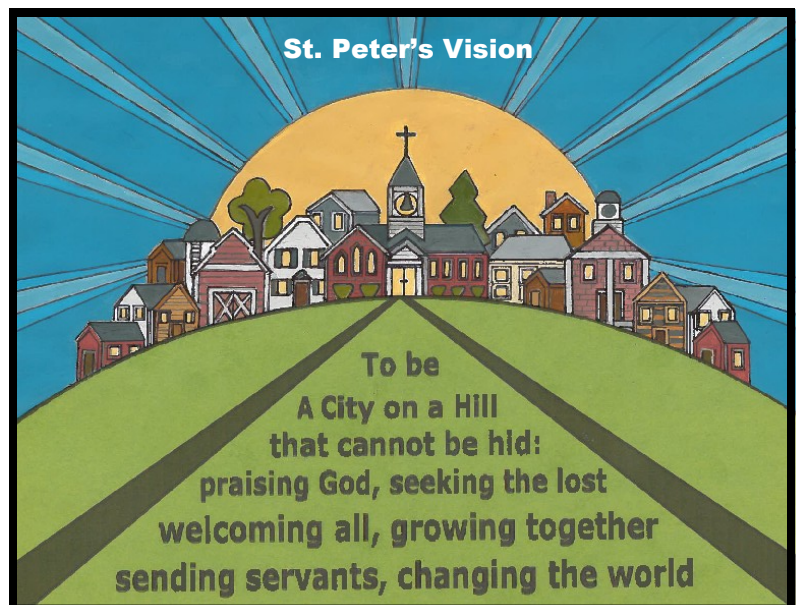
